

Crossing the Atlantic Ocean for the first time, the N.S. Savannah arrived at Bremerhaven, Germany, first European port of call, on June 18, 1964. The craft's European schedule includes a visit to Hamburg, Germany, and thereafter will take her to Ireland, England, Belgium, Spain, Italy, Greece, Turkey and the Scandinavian countries.

The N.S. Savannah is the world's first nuclear-powered passenger-cargo ship operated for the U.S. Government by American Export-Isbrandtsen Lines.
