NORWAY'S KING VISITS U.S. NUCLEAR SUBMARINE SKATE

OSIO - King Olav V became the first chief of a foreign state to board a U.S. muclear-powered submarine when he visited the USS Skate recently. The undersease craft arrived in Oslo from Bergen, Norway, where it received an impressive welcome following completion of its historic voyage under the Arctic ice pack. The Skate had reached the North Pole on August 11, just eight days after the USS Nautilus became history's first vessel to cross the "top of the world."
