Republican Party at its recent national convention in San Francisco's

Both were chosen unanimously on first-ballot roll-calls of the 1,323 / 3 - C delegates.

The Party headquarters has announced that the President will do much of his campaigning via television and radio, interspersed with "plane-hop" speeches in the major American cities, instead of the traditional "whistle-stop" tours by train.
