

United States President Harry S. Truman recently signed into law the bill to furnish emergency food aid to India. The new law provides a \$100,000,000 loan to India for the purchase of two million tons of food grains. Grain shipped under this new act to meet the serious food shortages in India is in addition to the 1,500,000 tons of grain sent to that country by the U.S. Government in the past year.
