

Senator John Fitzgerald Kennedy of Massachusetts, leader of the Democratic Party, was elected the thirty-fifth President of the United States in the national elections held November 8, 1960. He will be sworn in at inauguration ceremonies to be held in Washington, D. C., on January 20, 1961. At 43, Senator Kennedy is the youngest man ever elected President of the United States. He will also be the first American President of the Roman Catholic faith. On November 9, 1960, the day after election, Senator Kennedy pledged all his energies to advancing "the long-range interests of the United States and the cause of freedom around the world."
