LYNDON BAINES JOHNSON: VICE PRESIDENT-ELECT OF THE UNITED STATES

Senator Lyndon Baines Johnson of Texas, Senate Majority Leader, was elected the thirty-seventh Vice President of the United States in the national elections held November 8, 1960. He will be sworn in at inauguration ceremonies to be held in Washington, D. C. on January 20, 1961. Addressing delegates to the sixth parliamentary conference of the North Atlantic Treaty Organization in Paris on November 21, 1960, Senator Johnson, chairman of the U. S. delegation, pointed out that the leadership that is coming into power in the United States is determined "to make the most vigorous use of America's resources and capacities to assure their children, your children and the children of all nations a life without war -- a future of peace."
