LAST TRIP TO CAPITOL -- The horse-drawn caisson (above) bearing the flag-draped coffin of former President Lyndon B. Johnson approaches the Capitol in Washington. The body lay in state in the Rodunda (below) before it was returned to Texas for burial at the LBJ Ranch. Among the mourners joining Mrs. Johnson and her family in the Capitol were President and Mrs. Richard Nixon and Vice President and Mrs. Spiro Agnew. Mr. Johnson served 11 years in the House of Representatives and 12 years in the Senate, both of which meet in the Capitol, before becoming Vice President in 1961. In the latter post, he presided over the Senate until moving into the White House in November 1963. He retired to the Texas ranch home in January 1969. (73-319)
