The Freedom Bell rang out from West Berlin for the first time on October 24, 1950 (United Nations Day). The ten-ton bell, dedicated as a symbol of hope to peoples living behind the Iron Curtain, was financed by public subscription in the United States. Its ringing closes the daily radio program sponsored by the Crusade for Freedom, a private enterprise supported by liberty-loving American citizens. Inscribed on the bell are the words: "This world, under God, shall have a new birth of freedom."
