HERBERT HOOVER — U. S. ELDER STATESMAN

In 1947 Herbert Hoover was appointed by President Harry S. Truman of the United States to a nonpartisan 18-man Commission on Organization of the Executive Branch of the Government, set up at the direction of the United States Congress to study the administrative structure of the Nation and to make recommendations for its reorganization in the interest of greater efficiency. Mr. Hoover was unanimously chosen chairman of the commission by his fellow members.

A number of the recommendations of the commission, which issued its final report in May 1949, already have been adopted by the President and the Congress.
