A PLACE TO HONOR WOMEN ARTISTS

The new National Museum of Women in the Arts, believed to be the world's first museum dedicated to women artists, has opened in Washington with some 500 works from women around the world. The unique collection includes paintings, sculptures, photographs, and graphic arts by women from the 16th through the 20th centuries. The museum was founded by Wilhelmina Cole Holladay of Washington after becoming aware of the art world gender gap during a trip through Europe with her husband. The new museum now has 70,000 supporting members.
