WASHINGTON, D.C. -- The Apollo-Soyuz flight crews and support
members are given a briefing on the Aeronautics and Space
Artifacts in the Smithsonian Arts and Industries Building
by former Apollo II Astronaut Michael Collins, the Director
of the Air and Space Museum. In the photograph the first
powered aircraft to fly, the "Spirit of St. Louis", a lunar
module, and the Apollo II Spacecraft.

The Russian Cosmonauts and support crew members toured the
National Capital and visited with President Ford at the White
House in a two-day tour September 7-8, 1974 hosted by the
American Astronauts for the joint Apollo-Soyuz Space Mission
scheduled in July 1975.
