

MUTUAL ADMIRATION -- Mary Decker and Carl Lewis congratulate each other after their dazzling performances at the 1983 World Track and Field Championships in Helsinki. They have emerged as golden standouts among athletes competing for berths on the U.S. Olympic Team for the 1984 Games in Los Angeles. Lewis earned three gold medals and Decker two at the meet in Finland. A 22-year-old third-year student at the University of Houston (Texas), Lewis won the 100 meters and long jump competition and ran the last leg of the 4x100 meters relay for the winning U.S. team, which set a new world record in the event. The 25-year-old Decker, who lives in Eugene (Oregon), won the 1,500- and 3,000-meter races. (83-2296-C)
