

FIRST OF FOUR -- Carl Lewis of Houston, Texas, holds an American flag as he makes a victory lap after winning the men's 100-meter dash in the Los Angeles Memorial Coliseum. The 23-year-old also earned gold medals in the 200-meter dash, the long jump and the 400-meter relay, thus duplicating the effort of American Jesse Owens in the 1936 Games in Berlin. In the relay event at Los Angeles, Lewis anchored the U.S. team that set a new world record with a time of 37.83 seconds. The old mark of 38.62 was set by a U.S. quartet in 1983. (84-2768-C)
