Following are the new and old record times:

Naber, 55.49 seconds, old 56.19 set by Naber during the semifinal heats in Montreal, 56.30 held by Roland Mattes of East Germany.

Hencken, 1:03.11, old 1:03.62 set by Hencken in the semifinals, 1:03.88 set by Hencken in 1975 and tied by Hencken in the quarterfinals in Montreal.

Brunner, 1:59.23, old 1:53.63 held by Roger Pyttel of East Germany.

Furniss, 1:50.29, old 1:50.32 set by Furniss in 1975.
