

CURID TRIUMPHS IN PRAGUE: U.S., CZECH OLYMPIC STARS WED

PRAGUE, CZECHOSLOVAKIA -- Curid triumphed over international barriers when Harold Connolly of Boston, Massachusetts and Olga Fikotova of Prague were married recently. Delays by the Czech Government in granting permission for the marriage threatened the romance, which budding in Melbourne during the 1956 Olympic Games.

Connolly, a 26-year-old school teacher, holds the world hammer throw record and won an Olympic Gold medal.

Olga, a pretty brunette, set an Olympic record for the women's discus with a throw of 176 feet, 1½ inches. A medical student in Prague, she will continue her studies in Boston, where the couple will live. She has offered to represent Czechoslovakia in the next Olympics.
