Thirty four of the United States top amateur soccer players recently battled for 15 places on the 1956 U.S. Olympic soccer team in a hard fought game at St. Louis. With the participants divided into teams from the East and West, the game ended in a 1-1 tie.

West's goal tender Svend Engedahl (in cap) is shown after he had deflected ball headed by Buchanan Waid (in air), East's inside left. The ball sailed over the goal. Behind Engedahl is Herman Weeks, of St. Louis, a unanimous choice for the U.S. Olympic squad. Engedahl, from Los Angeles, was picked as the Olympic team goal tender over four other candidates.
