

"DO YOU REMEMBER...?"

An historic symbol of international friendship marking the settlement of a long-standing border dispute between Argentina and Chile was dedicated in March 13, 1904. The famous "Christ of the Andes" stands at the highest accessible point on the Uspallata Pass, inscribed with the words, "Sooner shall these mountains crumble into dust than Argentines and Chileans break the peace sworn at the feet of Christ the Redeemer." The 26-foot statue, designed by the Argentine sculptor, Mateo Alonso, was cast from melted cannon, and stands on a granite globe.
