BALTIMORE:

3. The silent guns of Old Fort McHenry still point their muzzles across
Baltimore harbor. This star-shaped fortress threw back two British fleets
in 1814 and inspired the poet, Francis Scott Key, to write "The Star-Spangled
Banner," now the national anthem of the United States. Port McHenry was used
as a prison during the American Civil War and as a hospital during World War I.
It is now a national park. (55-4263)
