

## THE LEGACY OF GEORGE WASHINGTON

The principles of George Washington, who led the Colonial forces in the successful fight for U. S. independence and then became the country's first President, are considered a valuable legacy by the American people. These principles on which the United States was founded will be reviewed again February 22, the <sup>230th</sup>~~220th~~ anniversary of Washington's birth to be observed throughout the nation.

Here, Washington is shown giving his first inaugural address to the U. S. Congress in which he said: "...the preservation of the sacred fire of liberty and the destiny of the republican model of government are justly considered, perhaps, as deeply, as finally, staked on the experiment entrusted to the hands of the American people."
