This map abows the systems used by states to select delegates to the 1960 Presidential nominating conventions. The shaded areas are the states that hold some form of primary election in which the rank-and-file party supporters, voting by secret ballot, indicate their preference for a Presidential nominee of their party. In the State of Alabama, marked by an asterisk, primaries are optional. The remaining states hold party conventions or select delegates to the national conventions by other organization processes.
