AMERICANS CHOOSE A PRESIDENT

On national election day this year (November 8, 1960), about 65,000,000 Americans voters will cast their ballots for President and Vice President of the United States and will elect candidates to other federal, state and local offices. Ahead of the party nominees are months of campaigning which will take them on speaking tours across the country. Newspapers and magazines will report their activities and statements and millions of Americans will see and hear the candidates in person or on television or hear them speak over the radio. The American people will have full opportunity to appraise the nominees and decide which candidates will win their vote.
