The Crusade For Freedom, a national campaign in the United States for the establishment of a popularly supported radio network to inform people behind the Iron Curtain of American aspirations for peace and international cooperation within the United Nations, was inaugurated recently in the Municipal Auditorium, Denver, Colorado, by General Dwight D. Eisenhower, President of Columbia University in New York City and former Supreme Commander of Allied Forces in Western Europe during World War II.

The symbol of the campaign of truth is the 10-ton Freedom Bell, cast in England, which will be hung in a shrine in the Western Zone of Berlin and dedicated on United Nations Day (October 24). Its initial ringing on that day will be broadcast throughout the world and echoed by church bells in all free countries.
