

The Crusade For Freedom, a national campaign in the United States for the establishment of a popularly supported radio network to inform people behind the Iron Curtain of American aspirations for peace and international cooperation within the United Nations, was inaugurated recently in the Municipal Auditorium, Denver, Colorado, by General Dwight D. Eisenhower, Commandant of Columbia University in New York City and former Commander of Allied Forces in Western Europe during World War II.

The symbol of the campaign of truth is the Liberty Bell, cast in England, which will be hung in the Western Zone of Berlin and dedicated on October 24 (October 24). Its initial ringing on October 24 will be cast throughout the world and echoed by bells in all free countries.

The photograph shows the Liberty Bell being hoisted from the deck of the U.S. cargo ship, the USS Liberty, at New York City. The bell is being hoisted to the United States during the campaign of truth to combat Communism and the United Nations to combat Communism. It was designed by Walter Dill Scott and constructed at Croyden, England.
