An agreement to provide for the establishment of a commission to help conserve fishery resources of the portionest Atlantic was signed recently (Feb. 8, 1918) in Dashington, D.C., capital of the United States, by ten maritime countries. Signatories to the agreement were Canada, Depart, France, Iceland, Memfoundland, Mormey, Fortugal, Spain, the United Singdom and the United States. The convention will go into force upon deposit of ratification by four of the signatories. The main purpose of the commission will be to collect scientific information on fisherics for the benefit of all countries concerned. It sill not have direct regulatory powers over fishing but will be permitted to recommend steps toward maintenance of fisheries by the governments involved. All nations represented at the Eashington conference are interested in maintaining resources of Inddock, rosefish, halitut, god and other fish of the Marth Atlantic. Some of the fishery areas there have become deplaced to such an extent that they produce only a fraction of their former output.

German Horsiber, Himister and Charge d'affaires ad interin of the Spanish Embassy in Bashington, and chairman of the Spanish delegation to the conference, affixes his eigenture to the agreement as other members of the delegation lock on. (ED-50908)
