Linked with Canada by Peace Bridge over the Niagara River, Buffalo is the second largest city in the State of New York and the 15th largest in the nation.

This is a view of Lafayette Square with its Civil War Monument shaft rising in the center park, honoring the dead of war between the North (the Union) and the South (the Confederacy) in the United States (1861-1865).

Located at the eastern tip of Lake Erie, midway between New York City and Chicago, Illinois, Buffalo is one of the largest inland water ports in the United States in value of waterborne commerce handled, the country's second largest railroad center and first city in the world in grain milling and distribution. It is a leading iron and steel center, an important chemical center, and western terminus of the Barge Canal.

Buffalo is a major port-of-call on the route to the St. Lawrence Seaway. The New York State Thruway goes along Buffalo's waterfront, crosses the Niagara River and Grand Island to Niagara Falls.

The city's industrial strength and economic importance are based on the broad diversity of its industries--more than 2,000 of them in the Buffalo-Niagara area, employing more than 200,000 people. Greater Buffalo has a population of more than one million persons. It has attractive suburbs, 3,000 acres of parks and an exceptional variety of opportunities for recreational pursuits. Vinculada con el Canadá por el puente de la Paz, sobre el río Niágara, la ciudad de Buffalo es la segunda ciudad del estado de Nueva York y la que hace el nº 15 en toda la nación. Esta es una vista de la plaza de Lafayette, con su obelisco del monumento a la Guerra Civil elevándose en el centro, en honor de los que murieron en la guerra entre el Norte (la Unión), y el Sur (la Confederación), en los Estados Unidos (1861-1865). Situada en el extremo oriental del lago Erie, a mitad de camino entre la ciudad de Nueva York y la de Chicago (Illinois), Buffalo es uno de los mayores puertos fluviales de los Estados Unidos.
