

PRINCETON -- A UNIVERSITY OF CREATIVE THOUGHT

Princeton University in Princeton, New Jersey, established in 1746, is one of the oldest universities in the United States. It is characterized by the concept of individualized education with a faculty of "teacher-scholars." Among the alumni of Princeton are two American Presidents, James Madison and Woodrow Wilson.

The Woodrow Wilson School of Public and International Affairs at Princeton University uses the conference method as a means of preparing its students to play an intelligent and effective role in public life.
