GIBES AND WESTINGHOUSE HOWCRED IN HALL OF FAME

The long, curving coloureds of New York University's Hall of Fame was dedicated in 1901 and since then the bronze busts of 85 Americans have been placed there. Every five years, people of all ages nominate those who they think have made the most cutstanding contributions to the United States and the world. A group of electors then make the ultimate choice from these nominations. The busts of Josiah Willard Gibbs and George Westinghouse are the most recent to be installed along the Hall's sculptures.
