

The United States Treasury recently presented to the District of Columbia a replica of the Liberty Bell which was rung on July 4, 1776, to announce the adoption of the U. S. Declaration of Independence by the Continental Congress. The replica was one of 59 bells cast in France and sent to each of the States of the Nation and the District of Columbia, for display in connection with the sale of U. S. Savings Bonds.

The bell presented to the District of Columbia is shown on the steps of the District Building (City Hall) in Washington.
