Technologists make adjustments on a retro-package ring designed to bring the two-man Gemini spacecraft down out of orbit. Astronauts are scheduled to remain weightless in space for up to two weeks at a time during 1965 Gemini flights, in preparation for trips to the moon in later years in the Apollo spacecraft.
