

FACES OF VICTORY -- Expressions of joy reflect the feelings of Brian Goodell (left) and John Naber after each set new world records and qualified for the U.S. Olympic swimming team during trials in Long Beach, California. Goodell, a 17-year-old high school junior from Mission Viejo (California) swam the 400-meter freestyle in 3 minutes 53.08 seconds to break the old mark of 3:53.31 set by Tim Shaw of the United States in 1975. Goodell also topped the 1,500 meter freestyle world record with a time of 15:06.66, eclipsing the pending mark of 15:10.89 set by Stephen Holland of Australia. Naber, a 20-year-old senior at the University of Southern California, won the 200-meter backstroke in 2:00.64 to better the previous world record of 2:01.87 set by Roland Matthes of East Germany in 1973.
