HIGHEST SCIENCE AWARD -- Dr. Linus Pauling, two-time Nobel Prize winner, receives the National Medal of Science from President Gerald Ford at the White House in Washington. Dr. Pauling was one of 13 distinguished Americans to receive the government's highest scientific honor. Mr. Ford said "the nation's commitment to that most fundamental of all inquiries -- basic research -- has not diminished." He promised increased spending in the area. Dr. Pauling won the Nobel award for chemistry in 1954 and the peace prize in 1962. He is currently researching the uses of Vitamin C in preventing and curing the common cold, and Vitamin B-6 in treating schizophrenia.
